Residency programme for emerging curators and Cultural Professionals (CPs)

OVERVIEW

Lidice Memorial in the Czech Republic is a public memory museum and a significant cultural hub dedicated to preserving the memory of the **Lidice Massacre of 1942**. Through its exhibitions and public programs, the Memorial promotes democratic values and international solidarity.

With the launch of the **Solidarity Knows No Borders** residency, **we invite emerging curators and CPs residing in any Creative Europe country to participate** in this exciting opportunity. The residency aims to foster artistic and cultural exchange, offering curators a platform for research, collaboration, and professional development. Residents will engage with the **Lidice Art Collection** (LAC), established in the 1960s by British physician **Sir Barnett Stross MP** (1903-1967). LAC is an international solidarity collection featuring over 600 works donated by artists worldwide, including **Gerhard Richter**, **Mona Hatoum**, and **Joseph Beuys**.

This residency will take place in Lidice from Monday 18 November to Friday 13 December 2024, focusing on memory preservation, democratic values, and art as a tool for empowerment. The residency project has been selected under conditions by Culture Moves Europe, a project funded by the European Union and implemented by Goethe-Institut. This work is produced with the financial assistance of the European Union. The views expressed herein can in no way be taken to reflect the official opinion of the European Union.

Residency Activities

Participants in the residency will benefit from the following activities:

- Curators and CPs will explore the Lidice Art Collection and conduct research on themes such as memory, solidarity, and cultural preservation.
- Regular **workshops and talks** with local artists and professionals, fostering collaboration and engagement with the local community.
- Mentoring sessions with experienced curators, 1-on1's, and peer discussions to enhance professional development.
- **Field trips** to local institutions and opportunities to network with professionals across the Czech Republic.
- Curators are encouraged to hold public workshops and talks to **interact with the local community** and enrich the cultural discourse.

Selected participants will receive:

- **Free accommodation** in the <u>Attic of the Lidice Gallery</u> provides comfortable living spaces close to the residency workspace.
- Access to shared facilities, including kitchen, lounge, and workspace, within the Lidice Gallery building.

ELIGIBILITY

We encourage applications from all backgrounds, communities, and industries and are committed to a residency programme that reflects diverse skills, experiences, and abilities.

To apply, applicants shall be:

- emerging curators and CPs from a wide range of backgrounds
- **resident in any Creative Europe country**. For the list of CE countries, please see CME Call for Residency Hosts, Section 1, pp. 4.;
- **proficient in English**, as all workshops, discussions, and mentoring sessions will be conducted in English;
- available for the full duration of the residency.
